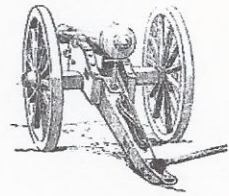


Annual Civil War Symposium

Minnesotans distinguished themselves on bloody battlefields from Shiloh to Fredericksburg yet faced tragedy at home. The Dakota Conflict of August and September 1862 meant that our soldiers would garrison and campaign on two fronts for the next three years. This third in a series of Civil War Sesquicentennial Symposia is sponsored by the Rochester, the St. Croix Valley, the Cannon Valley, the St. Cloud, the Hiawatha and the Twin Cities Civil War Roundtables in cooperation with the Minnesota Historical Society and the Civil War Sesquicentennial Task Force.
